## NOTE ON DIRECTORATE OF CIVIL RIGHTS ENFORCEMENT

The State of Karnataka was one of the Pioneer State in the country to recognize the need for a separate Police Establishment to collate, and supervise all criminal cases including those under the Untouchability (Offences) Act, 1955. Accordingly, with the passing of a Government Order in 1974, a separate cell in the C.I.D., called Civil Rights Enforcement Cell under the overall charge of a Superintendent of Police, was established. With the increase in standard of education and literacy among Members of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, there was hope that atrocities on them would come down. Yet, the atrocities on these Members of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes continues with the Parliament passing the effective legislation called the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 and Rules 1995. With the passing of this Act, the Government of Karnataka established a full pledged Police Directorate called **“Directorate of Civil Rights Enforcement”** under the charge of an Addl. Director General of Police with Superintendents of Police, heading a division in each Police Range Headquarters. The Job Chart and responsibilities of D.C.R.E. reads thus:-

The D.C.R.E. shall collect intelligence and investigate cases and submit reports to the Government in the following matters :-

1. Violation to Government Orders pertaining to reservations of 18% of posts in Government Services including judiciary, Local Bodies, Public Sectors Undertakings, Universities and other Government aided institutions and undertakings relating to, SCs/STs.

2. Violation of Government Orders pertaining to earmarking and utilization of 18% of the funds of the local bodies to be spent exclusively on schemes aided and the socio-economic betterment of SCs/STs.
3. Violation of the provisions of Karnataka Land Grant Rules pertaining to reservation of 50% of the Government Lands, surplus lands and excess Gomal lands relating to SCs/STs.
4. Violation of the directions of Government relating to eviction of the marginal and sufficient holders from encroachments of made by them on the Gomal lands confirming the rights of occupancy of the Gomal lands by the insufficient holder and landless people belonging to SCs/STs.
5. Violation of rules pertaining to grant of sites in so far as they relate to the claims of SCs/STs.
6. Wrongful alienation of the grant/service inam lands and house sites granted to SCs/STs.
7. Wrongful eviction of people belonging to SCs/STs by the landlords.
8. Wrongful evictions of people belonging to SCs/STs from the Government/Gomal/Service Inam lands by other communities or by the Government agencies.
9. Cases of production of false cases certificate by people belonging to other communities for claiming the benefits that are extended to the SCs/STs.



10. Offences committed against the provisions of the “Bonded Labour System (abolition) ordinance, 1975” concerning SCs/STs.
11. Offences committed against the provisions of the Karnataka Debt Relief Ordinance 1975 concerning SCs/STs.
12. All instances of mismanagements and misuses of grants in aid by the authorities of the Government aided hostels pertaining to Social Welfare Department.
13. Any other matters pertaining to the violation of constitutional safeguards and protection extended to SCs/STs.
14. Any matter pertaining to the contravention or violation of any law or rule or Executive Order aimed at the Socio-Economic upliftment and Welfare of the SCs/STs.

The Government of Karnataka, in supersession of the notification of model contingency plan dated 24-11-2000, hereby notify this contingency plan as in Annexure under Rule 15 of The Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (prevention of atrocities) Rules 1995 and Amended Rules 2016

To prevent the commission of offences of atrocities against the members of SCs/STs, the existing Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (prevention of atrocities) Act 1989 has been amended with inclusion of more offences and relief to be provided along with the rehabilitation of the victims under the Amended Act 2015 and Rules 2016.

It shall be the duty of the district administration, more particularly the District Magistrate and Superintendent of Police, Commissioner of Police, to ensure that effective steps are taken to prevent the occurrence of atrocities against SC/ST persons within their jurisdiction. This shall include periodic visits to sensitive areas, supervision of investigation / prosecution of offences under the Act, periodically meeting the members of the community from all over the district and implementation of all other provisions of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 /Amended Act 2015 and Rules 2016 there under.

Whenever an atrocity takes place in the district, it shall be the duty of all departments/ agencies/ corporations / organizations of Government in the district to fulfil their role in the implementation of Contingency Plan effectively so that the victims of atrocities are properly rehabilitated as soon as possible, effective action is taken against the culprits who perpetrated the atrocity and security is restored not only amongst the members of SC/ST affected by the atrocity but also among the general public in the area.
